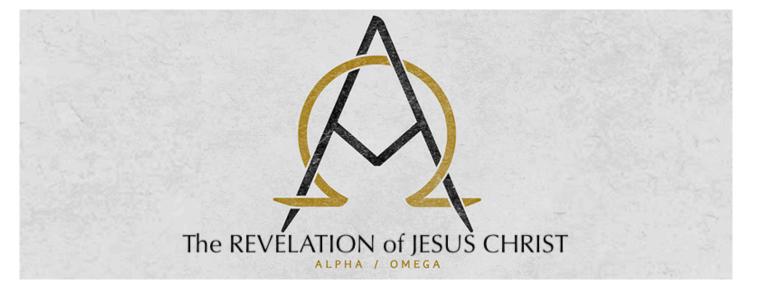


Session 32 — The Song of Moses and of the Lamb [Revelation 15] — October 3, 2021

- I. God has blessed us with the gift of **song** to **unite**, **uplift**, and **comfort** us both in this life and **beyond** in the life to come.
- II. As the end draws near, God's righteous <u>anger</u> will begin to <u>burn hotter</u> as He pours out the final 7 <u>plagues</u> upon the <u>Beast</u> and his <u>kingdom</u>.
- III. Once God's anger has reached a **boiling point**, Jesus will **explode** on the scene in **wrath** and break out upon the ungodly as an **all** -**consuming** fire.
- IV.The song of <u>Moses</u> celebrates God's <u>victory</u> over <u>Pharaoh</u>, yet it ultimately points to God's <u>final triumph</u> when <u>Jesus</u> returns to destroy the Beast and <u>save</u> His <u>people</u>!

Application —

- → May the LORD forever be our strength and our song, as He alone is worthy of praise both in times of sorrow and joy!
- Do not underestimate the power and blessing of corporate worship, as we unite as one voice to proclaim the gospel of Christ!



Small Group Listening Guide — October 3, 2021

Read Revelation 15 Out Loud

- 1. How does God use the gift of song to unite, uplift and comfort us?
- 2. What are some worship songs God has used in your life to carry you through difficult times or remind you of His promises?
- 3. How should we understand God's "wrath" or anger in this passage, considering John uses the Greek word **thumos** instead of **orge**? [note thumos means to get worked up in anger, while orge is the final expression of built-up wrath]
- 4. What is the primary expression associated with God's "orge" wrath in 2 Peter 3:7-12 and 2 Thessalonians 1:5-8?
- 5. What are the most obvious connections between Moses and Jesus, especially when it comes to the prophetic patterns of the Exodus and the coming Day of the LORD?
- 6. Read Zephaniah 3:14-18. How will Jesus respond on the Day He triumphs in victory?
